PICKERTINGTON RESIDENT EARNS VALEDICTORIAN HONORS AT SIXTEEN

COLUMBUS, OH (May 25, 2010) – Michael Brovarenko, of Pickerington, was recently named the valedictorian of the 2010 graduating class of Virtual Community School of Ohio (VCS Ohio).
